

In 2020 we have planned these four major initiatives:





Launch YGC Accelerator, a six-month program to help accelerate the startups journey towards revenue generation and seed funding

Increase the number of community engagement programs

The community is steadily growing and the impact of the Yarl IT Hub activities is clearly felt at the grassroots level. We now see Jaffna getting recognized as the second most important place for startups in the island after Colombo in many of the ecosystem studies and reports published by multiple agencies.

It is only with the support of the community, our partners, and sponsors we have been able to accomplish so much. By keeping the focus on fostering entrepreneurship, education, innovation, and technology adoption, we can and will grow opportunities for the community.

Ūki (ஊக்கி)

Uki is a full scholarship based accelerator program for coding with classes online and at centers in Jaffna and Kilinochchi. Uki engages students who have not got access to tertiary education or any form of vocational education and provides them with the necessary training to enter the tech industry or to attempt a startup.

Uki Jaffna


Uki Jaffna began operations in early 2017 and has now successfully completed five cohorts with 68 students completing the program.

Uki Jaffna's fourth cohort began on the 7th of November 2018 and concluded on the 30th of April 2019 and 18 students graduated from the program. Those who were available got internships in well-known companies and startups. A group of four from the batch has a startup called "Smiley Gifts", an online gift delivery platform.

Uki's fifth batch started on the 6th of May 2019 and concluded on the 26th of October 2019. Il students graduated from this batch.

Uki's sixth batch began on the 6th of November 2019 with 20 students.

The teams from Uki Jaffna have been consistent participants at Yarl Geek Challenge and UNDP's hackathons.

Uki Kilinochchi


In the year 2019 Uki commenced operations in Kilinochchi. The first cohort of Uki Kilinochchi successfully completed the six-month training program and all the students who were available for the internship got internships.

From Cohort 1, Team Olai & Team Thoori were finalists of Yarl Geek Challenge, Season 8. Team Olai was the Runners Up of YGC 8 Senior. Both team Olai & Thoori have started their e-commerce business and are in operation now.

Uki Cohort -2 has commenced and the cohort size in Kilinochchi has been increased to 20.













Yarl Geek Challenge Season 8 – Junior

The students were asked to send their applications under any of these four categories: Web application, mobile application, hardware application, and innovative product. The deadline for sending the applications to the school was on the 9th of June 2019. Applications were received from 75 teams, and the teams competed in their respective zones on the 15th of June 2019. Following the evaluations, 30 teams were selected to compete in the two-day hackathon in Jaffna on 29th and 30th of June 2019.

The overall title winners for the four categories were as follows:

Best Web Application was won by Kokuvil Hindu College for developing Class Time Manager, a mobile app for private institutions to map their schedules and classes.

Best Hardware application was won by Hartley College for its home automation and security system. The team designed a home security system which does motion detection, controls electronic products and detects gas leakage and CO2.

Best Mobile Application was won by a team from Jaffna Hindu College for an Order Management System.

Best Innovative Product was won by Jaffna College for its Auto Bubble Car.



Yarl Geek Challenge Season 8 - Senior

Yarl Geek Challenge was held this year for the 8th consecutive year. The lead up to the main event saw the webinars to the teams on Business Modelling Canvas and Pitch Deck Preparation. Thereafter teams were paired with International mentors in Canada and US to have one-on-one mentoring sessions. After a rigorous round of filtering, 21 teams qualified for the Yarl Geek Challenge weekend in Jaffna.

The Yarl Geek Challenge weekend in Jaffna was again run on a packed agenda with the following keynote speakers delivering excellent and relevant content to the community.

Yarl Geek Challenge Season 8 - Senior

At the end of the YGC weekend in Jaffna 10 teams were chosen for the finale held in Colombo.

At the finale Team Magenda was declared as winners, Team Tharuvi were the runners up and Team Musketeers were the 2nd runners up.

Magenda (Winning Team)

Magenda has an app as a hub for event organizers. The app aims to offer attendees information about the event, live feedback and reactions to programmes.

Tharuvi (Runners Up)

Dubbed Olai, the team proposes an online store to promote Jaffna's high-quality palmyra products through the digital space.

Musketeers (2nd Runners Up)

Happy Petal is an automated smart greenhouse. It includes an automated water system and temperature control system. The lack of any artificial fertiliser makes the harvest organic.









Āki (ஆக்கி)



www.aki.coach was launched in 2019 with the following learning courses and forums:

- Year 10 and Year 11 Mathematics and Science lesson videos with self-diagnostic tests for students.
- Advanced level question and answer forum with more than 500 questions in the following subject areas Combined Mathematics, Biology, Chemistry and Physics
- Node JS Programming course

The Team also worked on developing a content in the box solution, which will allow students in schools with sporadic internet access to access the content of Aki using offline mode, which will get synched with Aki's cloud infrastructure as and when connectivity is available.





Tulir (துளிர்)

In order to achieve the strategic goal of Yarl IT Hub being a catalyst in the formation of 100 startups and SMEs by 2022, one of the actions was to create a social innovation center. In September 2018, this took shape and it was named as Thulir.

Thulir has three full time researchers who have been given the mandate of creating reports, business models and pieces of technology which can be transferred to the community. In turn the community can make use of these to create economic opportunities and employment at grass root level.

They have published one reports from the researched they have done and some of the community members have already shown interest to work on proposals mentioned in the report.






Hatch Kalam (ஹட்ச் களம்)

Hatch Kalam is a co-working space and maker space in Jaffna. This is a joint initiative by GIZ, Hatch and Yarl IT Hub. Tech-related workshops are conducted at the maker space and day to day occupancy of the co-working space has seen a steady growth, which is encouraging for the future.

The maker space gives an environment for kids to come and create or build new things. We encourage kids to come here and make use of this space.

Hatch Kalam played host role to most of the Yarl IT Hub Jaffna events in 2019, which included the networking dinner of Yarl Geek Challenge, Yarl Geek Challenge Junior etc. Hatch Kalam is also used by other organizations to run their events. Events such as workshops, exhibitions, community meetups etc. are held here on a regular basis. We welcome anyone who is interested to use this space.





Cutar சுடர்)

Cutar is another initiative of Yarl IT Hub which was started with the idea of encouraging and supporting women getting into technology and entrepreneurship.

We identified that promoting diversity starts from encouraging girls at school. Hence, right after the launch in 2018, the first event was a forum with ICT teachers from girls' schools to identify the challenges and needs from their perspective. This year too there was a workshop conducted to encourage and support girls who would like to learn coding.

We also understand that it is very important to provide access to role models from the same environment to motivate the younger generations. Hence we are in the process of connecting women who have braved and succeeded in the tech industry. We also put the girls together with successful women entrepreneurs.




